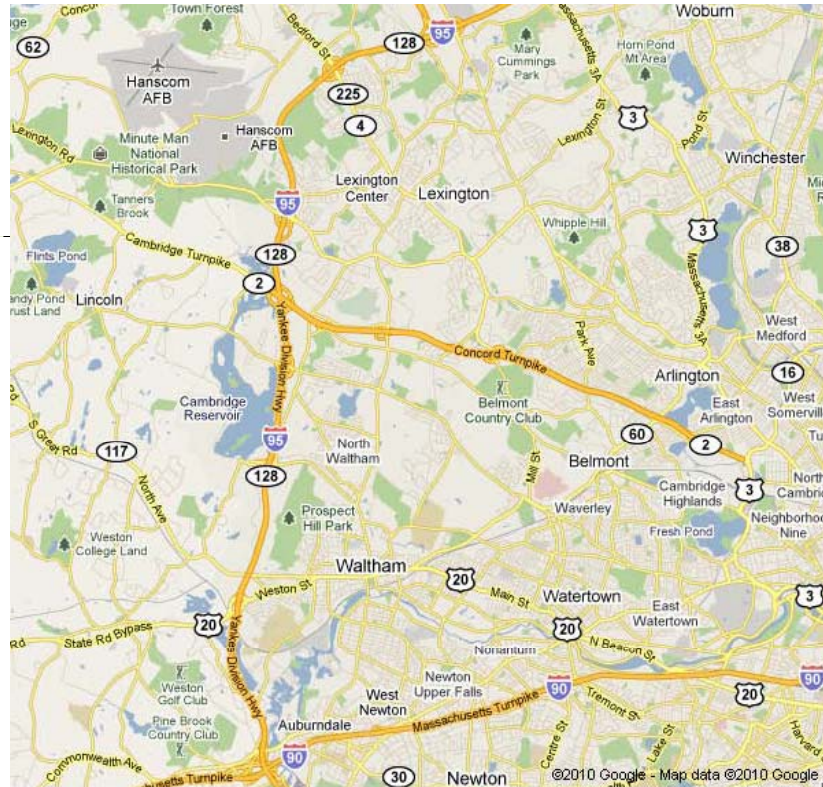

### **1. Traffic and Transportation Alternatives**

# Results

- Prepared 3 Issue Briefs
  - Meetings with MassDOT
  - Supported joint efforts of the Central Corridor Coalition (C3), representing the communities of Burlington, Lincoln, Lexington, Waltham and Weston.
  - Coordinated efforts of the MAPC to develop a single common transportation survey document.
  - Feedback to NSTAR on proposed service upgrades, maintenance challenges, and response time to power outages.
  - Support efforts of the 128 Business Council to enhance its shuttle service.
  - Stakeholder coordination with the Waltham West Chamber of Commerce, The NAIOP, and the Mass Life Sciences Center, as well as state and federal legislators.
